 - An introductory study of the cells, tissue and organ systems of the human organism. Nervous, cardiovascular, respiratory, digestive, and excretory physiology will be emphasized.
- BIO 120 Principles of Anatomy and Physiology Lab. Wednesday 10:15 AM 12:00 PM. Friday 1:00 – 4:00 PM. (5/28/19 – 07/26/19). MS or terminal degree in related discipline.
 - Using a hands-on approach, students will explore major anatomical and physiological concepts. Cytological and anatomical concepts will be investigated through models. Physiological concepts will be examined though in-class experiments as well as dissection of preserved pigs, and cadaver observation.
- BIO 202 Anatomy and Physiology II. Wednesday/Friday 9:00 10:59 AM. (5/28/19 07/26/19). MS or terminal degree in related discipline.
 - This course will cover the structure and function of cardiovascular, immune, respiratory, digestive, renal, and reproductive systems, as well as metabolism and homeostatic control.

 - Application of anatomical and physiological concepts in a laboratory setting. Microscopic analysis of select tissues will be coupled with cadaver inspection, models, dissections, and laboratory exercises.
