The Theology faculty will teach 4 undergraduate courses in Fall 2021, involving 2 course preps (with 2 sections of each course, with a maximum of 25 students in each section). This is a semester-long replacement position for a faculty member on sabbatical.

Essential Functions:

The faculty member will:

- Teach 12 credit hours
- Hold 10 office hours per week and be accessible to students
- Provide assessment data from courses

Required Education and Experience:

By August 2021, the candidate should have completed a terminal degree in Theology or a related field with strong understanding of and commitment to the Catholic theological tradition. ABD by August 2021 will be considered, as will a Master's degree with teaching experience.

Readiness to teach in a student-centered environment with a focus on the contributions of women and people of color to the discipline; commitment to education of undergraduate women; effective interpersonal relationship skills
