



## Doctor of Physical Therapy – Musculoskeletal Track

College of Saint Mary (CSM) Division of Health Professions is currently inviting applications for a full-time 12-month non-tenured faculty appointment at the Instructor or Assistant Professor rank to teach in the musculoskeletal track for a developing blended learning Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) Program in Omaha, NE. This DPT program is completed in under 3 years and uses a combination of online and on-campus learning experiences to educate future practitioners. The blended learning model allows faculty to live remotely from campus. However, DPT faculty must be able to travel to and stay in Omaha for designated time periods each semester.

In addition to teaching in the musculoskeletal track, this faculty member will participate in faculty-led student research projects, assist with mentoring in related area of expertise within the CSM DPT Clinical Education Program, and serve as a clinical instructor in the integrated clinical education experiences. The candidate will be expected to develop and sustain an independent research agenda. Other expectations include participation in curriculum development, student advising, providing treatment/and or mentorship in pro bono clinic, completing clinical education site visits, assisting with student recruitment and retention efforts, participating in college and department accreditation activities, and service to the department, college, community, and the profession. The successful candidate must work well in a team environment and feel comfortable working independently. In addition, the ideal candidate will have strong communication, problem-solving, clinical reasoning, organization, and self-assessment skills.

### **Minimum Qualifications Education & Experience Requirements:**

- Graduate of an accredited physical therapist education program.
- A terminal academic degree (PhD, EdD, DHS) is preferred.
- Should be licensed or eligible for licensure in Nebraska.
- Member of the American Physical Therapy Association.
- Prior teaching experience in a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant education program.
- Graduate of an accredited orthopedic or sports residency and/or fellowship program preferred.
- Board Certified Orthopedic or Sports Clinical Specialist.
- Minimum of 5 years of experience as a licensed physical therapist.
- Able to work with students with special needs based on the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- Prior teaching experience in distance education preferred.
- Knowledge of educational management and adult learning theories and principles preferred.
