In honor of Women's History Month, the lives of three significant Latin women will be celebrated on Thursday, March 25, when College of Saint Mary presents the musical theatre production, *Tres Vidas*.

Tres Vidas celebrates the life, times and work of three significant Latin and South American women: painter Frida Kahlo of Mexico; peasant activist Rufina Amaya of El Salvador; and poet Alfonsina Storni of Argentina.

Presented by the Core Ensemble – Tahirah Whittington, cello; Hugh Hinton, piano; Michael Parola, percussion; and featured actress Georgina Corbo – *Tres Vidas* presents dynamic situations timeless in their emotional appeal and connection to audiences across all gender and ethnic spectrums.

Since its inception in 1993, the Core Ensemble has toured around the world and was the recipient of the Eugene McDermott Award for Excellence in the Arts in 2000. A native of Cuba, Georgina Corbo is a graduate of the acting program at SUNY Purchase and has appeared in numerous television, film and Broadway productions.
